








- The Partido Popular obtains a resounding victory, reaching 65 seats, compared to the 30 obtained in 2019. The abstention of Vox would be enough to govern alone. The right-wing bloc thus obtained a comfortable absolute majority.
- The left once again fails to reach a government majority in the Community of Madrid. Más Madrid stands as the first force of the left-wing bloc in number of seats although tied at 24 seats with the PSOE.
- Unidas Podemos obtains a disappointing result in spite of the bet made by Pablo Iglesias abandoning his position in the Government.
  The bad result also precipitates his abandonment of politics.
- Ciudadanos continues the fall started in the general elections of November 2019 and for the first time since 2015 will not have representation in the Madrid chamber. The poor result opens a question mark over the future of the party at the national level.
- In spite of the pandemic, the turnout has reached record figures, above 75%, the highest in a regional election in the Community of Madrid.
- Finally, it should be noted that the mandate resulting from these elections will only last until 2023, when new regional elections will have to be called, given the statutory provision.



#### Scenarios for reaching an agreement

#### Scenario 1

The first posible scenario is that Vox votes in favor of the investiture of Isabel Díaz Ayuso and the sum of their deputies to that of the Popular Party reach the absolute majority. That stands at 69 seats and the two right wing parties have obtained both together 78 seats. The unknown in such a case would be to determine whether Vox would enter in the regional government.

#### Scenario 2

Isabel Díaz Ayuso will only need the affirmative votes of its party deputies in the second vote if at least another party abstains. That party could likely be Vox. The sum of the left wing parties would only reach 58 seats, 7 less than those obtained by the Popular Party alone.
